
The International Union of Pure and Applied Biophysics (IUPAB) Congress, originally scheduled for October 2020, has been rescheduled for 4-8 October 2021.



We are pleased to announce that the ITTS is in the process of partnering with <u>Frontiers</u> in <u>Physiology</u>: <u>Membrane Physiology and Membrane Biophysics</u> section.

Benefits for the ITTS include partnering with an established, open access journal at no cost to the ITTS, exposure of the ITTS to a broader audience, and 10% revenue return on any article collections organized by the ITTS. Standard article processing charges apply for authors on all submissions. The goal is to form a standing collaboration of developing a Research Topic (article collection) from the ITTS biennial meeting and/or other related meetings/workshops. We anticipate that the first article collection will come from the 2019 Budapest FEBS Advanced Course, organized by Balázs Sarkadi.

Dr. Christoph Fahlke, newly appointed Chief Editor, assures a transparent review process under his leadership. In addition, he emphasizes the key role that associate editors play in shaping a journal. He would like to nominate members from the society as associate editors. His vision for the journal is to cover transporter function at all scales, from QM/MM or atomistic simulations to work on animal models of human diseases or with patients. 



Chris is a Lecturer in Biochemistry at the University of Kent, UK. Chris' lab is interested in the molecular mechanisms of secondary-active transporters. In particular, the current research in Chris' lab is focused on understanding the mechanism of SLC13 family members that are associated with lifespan extension and agerelated metabolic diseases, and transporters associated with bacterial viability and antimicrobial resistance.
